# Norfolk County Council's £100,000 winter warmer for older people

Norfolk County Council has agreed to hand the cash to Age UK Norfolk for the charity's Warm Winter Fund.

The one-off grant, which comes from a forecast under-spend on the County Hall budget, will be used by Age UK Norfolk to offer small grants of between £100 to £200 to older people struggling to pay fuel bills. It will also help pay for further work to look at the underlying need for such support as heating bills continue to rise.

County Council Leader Derrick Murphy said: "This is one way in which some of Norfolk's most vulnerable residents can directly benefit from the sound management of the council's finances and our continued determination to drive down costs.

"The winter can be a real struggle for people trying to get by on a pension. With heating costs rising year on year, it is harder than ever for older people to keep warm. For some the stark choice is between heating properly or eating properly. This grant to Age UK Norfolk complements the county council's Warm Winter campaign and will allow many more older people to receive help. I hope that this will take away some of their worries about the cold months ahead."

Linda Gill, information and advice development manager at Age UK Norfolk, said the boost had come out of the blue. She said: "I couldn't be more delighted. This amount of money will make a real difference to older people in fuel poverty or fuel debt. It's tremendous news."

The Norfolk Community Foundation, backed by the EDP and sister paper the Norwich Evening News, has launched a Surviving Winter campaign - designed to help elderly and vulnerable people get through the cold spell. Last year's Surviving Winter appeal raised £55,000 in Norfolk, doubling its original target, meaning grants could be made to 239 households.

Age UK Norfolk has already started receiving calls from people who wish to apply for help this year. Surviving Winter co-ordinator Jasmine Toombs said: "Everyone I've spoken to has said they're worried, fuel prices are going up and it's a lot out of their pension."

Through raffles, collections and fundraising we have managed to donate a staggering £800 to our chosen charity this year - St Martin's Housing Trust.

For those of you who are not familiar with St Martin's Housing Trust, below is a little information about this very worthwhile charity:

### St Martin's Housing Trust Mission Statement

St Martins Housing Trust strives to address the needs of homeless people in Norwich. They offer emergency direct access accommodation, residential care, support and development to enable everyone to achieve their full potential and a greater level of independence.

### How it all began...

St Martins Housing Trust started life as the Norwich Night Shelter Project. The original Night Shelter at St James Church on Barrack Street opened in 1972 in response to the growing problem of homelessness in Norwich. In spite of the very basic amenities, the Night Shelter was in ever increasing demand, and within a few years new premises were needed to cope with the swelling number of Night Shelter users. In 1976, the Shelter relocated to St Martin at Oak, a redundant church on Oak Street. From this point on the Trust developed a wide range of complementary services that responded to the needs and expectations of homeless people. In April 2002 the Night Shelter was replaced by a new, purpose-built Direct Access and Resettlement Hostel (Bishopbridge House) at Gas Hill, off Riverside Road, Norwich.

# How did you spend August?



I spent the middle two weeks of August taking part in the Grand Masters Hockey World Cup, held at the Oxford Hawks Ground in Oxford.

Grand Masters Hockey covers three age groups; Over 60 (Grand Masters) Over 65 (Great Grand Masters)

Over 70 (Senior Grand Masters)

Forty teams took part from ten countries, including South Africa, Australia, New Zealand and Japan, as well as the main European countries. Over 1,000 players took part with the eldest from Japan aged 86.


In addition to the World Cup, a second competition was held, called The Tournament Trophy. England had teams in both competitions.

I played for England LX in the over 70 (Senior Grand Masters) in The Tournament Trophy. In our group were Southern Cross from Australia, Northern Stars from Scotland and an Alliance Multinational side. We played six games in ten days, finishing second to Southern Cross (Australia). I came back with a Silver Medal.

This was my first International for England - not

bad for a 72 year old - and I have only been playing for 55 years!!!

The LX England Club was founded in 1995, with the object of providing players over the age of 60 with the opportunity to play competitive hockey against teams of a similar age, both in the UK and around the world.



In 2013 there is a tournament in Barcelona and in January there is a team travelling to New Zealand. The Grand Masters Hockey World Cup is being held in The Hague, Holland in 2014.
