Winter has arrived, the clocks went back, and we all gained an hour, which personally was duly spent as an extra hour in the garden. We have been very lucky with the warmer weather so late in the season, but the nights are now starting to pull in.

We have had some great news, that the Bus Stop on the main Mundesley Road, will now be an official stop. So all being well, we will have a kerbed bus stop, warning signs, and an orange bust stop cage painted onto the road. We are hoping this will in turn encourage drivers to be more aware of their speed and surroundings. Also, there will be signage such as 'Pedestrians Crossing' at the crossing point. Add to that, a formal trod which will be installed along the verges, to ensure further safety of all pedestrians. District Councillor Peter Neatherway and I, (Peter has continually been in contact with Highways Department, following the recent car accidents and ongoing speed issues), knocked on the doors of those who's frontage will be affected to discuss their thoughts, as they all so very kindly keep the verge, in turn the village looking smart! Thankfully all those who will be affected, were in favour of the project, in hope that it will slow traffic down. It was lovely to meet the residents, old and new and to have a chat, and to hopefully dispel any concerns.

This will be funded by Highways whilst the funding is still available to them.

Also, Peter as his capacity as District Councillor, has found the funding towards a bus shelter to be positioned there, which is great news, Thank you Peter !

This brings me back to the darker nights, **please** do ensure that yourselves and children are visible when using the crossing when it is darker.

The Christmas Trees have been ordered, and one gratefully donated by MADRA, as usual we shall have one at Knapton Green and one by the Village Sign. These hopefully will be up at the beginning of December.

Hopefully by the time you have read this, we will have a full board of Councillors, or certainly on our way to fulfilling all vacancies. We are very grateful to all who join us, for volunteering their time to provide service for the village as a whole.

TALES FROM THE COMPOST HEAP

Hello Everyone,

Hasn't the growing year gone fast. But you can still sow some seeds. If you have a greenhouse, you can sow lettuce and greens that you can cut again several times. Garlic and onion sets can go in anytime before Christmas.

The sweet corn I mentioned in the last TALES I planted late, I didn't think I would get any cobs, well I had over twenty, some we enjoyed on the cob, but the rest I stripped and have got three bags of kernels in the freezer, so it was a pleasant surprise to get so much sweet corn to enjoy during the winter. The chickens loved the cobs.

The greens are looking good, maybe we will have some brussels for Christmas!

Some of the allotment holders potatoes were not very good, it was such funny weather, so much rain then really dry and the slugs were terrible, I have not seen so many. But gardeners are great at battling the bugs ,egg shells are great, beer traps, you have to try them all to protect your crops and keep those little beasies away!

Some of our allotment holders have had success, lovely big carrots and parsnips. I have saved the seed of one of my parsnips, so I hope for a good crop next year.

My tomatoes were not brilliant, I have had a few but they are not the same as the old seed, I will have to hunt for new seeds for next year.

Our new allotment holder is doing really well, he is doing the no dig method, some of our holders are trying this method already with great success. He has already planted a bed of onion sets. It is always interest- ing when a new grower comes to join us. Gardeners are always learning.

A lot of holders have had lots of tasty beans ,dif erent varieties, I have some in the freezer, and soft fruit has been good too ,there are little bags of blackberries in the freezer, ready to make jelly YUM YUM!! The pear tree was loaded , so many to share around.

Well everyone, enjoy you rest from gardening although it is a nice feeling getting rugged up from the cold and heading outside, tidying and maybe doing a little weeding with your fork, try not to use you spade, think of the worms !!

Have a nice Christmas and enjoy all your produce.

A Booking System for Norfolk Recycling Centres

You will need to book to visit from 18 November 2024

We are introducing a new booking system for all Norfolk recycling centres.

From 18 November 2024 you must have booked a 15-minute time slot to visit a Norfolk recycling centre.

From Monday 11 November 2024 you will be able to book for 18 November onwards. If you want to visit a recycling centre before 18 November you do not need to book.

You can book up to one week in advance of your visit.

Each time slot is 15 minutes. You will need to arrive within the time you have booked.

There is no charge to make a booking and you can make as many bookings as you need. Charges still apply for<u>trade</u> <u>waste</u> and <u>household DIY waste</u> over the free limit. You can only book one slot at a time. But as long as they are available, you can book as many slots as you need each day.

How to book to visit a recycling centre

You will need to book to visit from 18 November 2024

Book online

From 18 November 2024 you will need a booking to visit. You will be able to book using the Norfolk County Council website from 11 November 2024.

When you book you will select the recycling centre, date and time you want to visit. You will need to enter the following details:

- Your name
- Your address
- Registration number of the vehicle you will use when you visit
- Your email address

Whether you are bringing DIY waste

We will send you a booking confirmation by email.

You will need to enter these details each time you book. You can make the process quicker by registering for a <u>MyNorfolk</u> <u>account</u> which will automatically fill in some of these details.

You will also be able to change or cancel your booking if needed.

Book by phone

People who don't have access to the internet can call our Customer Service Centre on <u>0344 800 8020</u> to make a booking. They will make the booking for you and provide you with a confirmation number.

Norfolk libraries also provide internet access for anyone without the internet at home.
