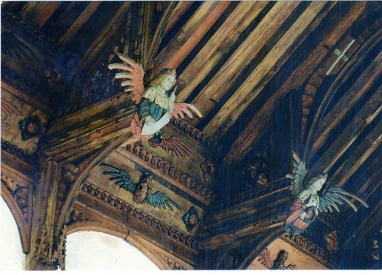

Let's 'Raise The Roof' together for Knapton!



A major fundraising fortnight is planned for Knapton as we 'Raise the Roof' to kick start a Heritage Lottery Fund bid to preserve the 'Angels of Knapton' for future generations.

St Peter & St Paul's Parish Church has the distinction of possessing a magnificent Medieval Double Hammer Beamed Angel Roof, constructed in 1503, and which is unique in Europe. Legend has it that the timbers came from a shipwreck off the coast of Mundesley and that they had been destined for Ireland. The roof is one of the widest in the country, crossing about 12 meters in a single span, a remarkable feat. The beams and spandrels are richly carved with three tiers of angels with outspread wings.

Heritage Weekend 27 & 28 July 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.



The fundraising activities commence on the weekend of **27 and 28 July** with our Heritage Weekend. The Church will be open all weekend with an Open Tower, to see how the bells are rung; historical photographic displays; a flower display; and an exhibition of paintings by local artists. The Methodist Church will be serving refreshments and having a raffle (all day on the 27th and from 11:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on the 28th). On Saturday 27th the Village Hall will be hosting a sale of crafts, table top bric-a-brac, a wonderful selection of cakes and a bottle stall, and several homes in the village will be holding garage sales (for this one day only).

Notes from Meeting between Victory Housing and Knapton Parish Council

June 11, 2013

Robert Ashton from Jossil Jewberry was present to meet Parish Council representatives from the villages affected by Victory Housing's Affordable Home Scheme, and to relay their concerns to Victory Housing.

'Exception sites' such as the one in Knapton are intended to provide affordable housing with priority for people with a connection to the village. It seems likely the development will go ahead by 2015, whatever local feeling is. For this reason, Robert Ashton wants to get the best for Knapton.

The preference of the meeting was for bungalows, as originally planned, and not houses. Two bedroomed bungalows offered to elderly people or young couples could free up larger houses for families. It would also enable elderly people to stay in Knapton. It is very desirable to have some green space left, especially as some of the housing would be for families. Issues such as roads, drainage etc. are not worth raising in any objection to the building, as these will be dealt with when Planning Permission is applied for. Victory Housing is a non-profit making organisation with assets being re-invested and the buildings would be "asset locked" so they could not be sold at any time in the future.

David Bishop-Laggett, on behalf of the Parish Council, will contact Victory Housing to ask for another meeting with Phil Rose (Community Land Trust Development Manager, Foundation East). He will also put forward the preference for bungalows.

Residents are encouraged to write to or to email their thoughts/objections/support to Knapton Parish Council (via Dee Holroyd, Parish Clerk). These letters will be kept on file to support any future action by the village. Robert Ashton will feed back to Victory Housing any such information.
