Part of my role as your Community Engagement Officer is to support our local Community Speed Watch teams. The scheme was launched in 2007 and is a project working across Norfolk empowering communities to play an active part alongside the Police and the Safety Camera Partnership in tackling the problem of speeding. Volunteers are given full training and only carry out speed checks at sites that have been risk assessed by the police. Speed checks are carried out in 30 and 40mph limits at locations chosen by the volunteers. The volunteers record details of offending vehicles and these are passed to the Safety Camera Partnership team who send a warning letter to the registered keeper of offending vehicles. Persistent offenders are visited by a Police Officer.

During the last month Officers have been conducting patrols and liaising with residents in the Hadfield Road area regarding Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) around Punks tunnel. We are pleased to confirm that the amount of reports of ASB have decreased due to the Police activity and working with the youths involved.

Patrols have been increased in the Acorn Road Park area due to an increase of noise, litter and ASB in the evenings.

Your Beat Managers PC Paul Gwynn and PC Emma Robinson have continued their engagement with local Councils, Schools, children's homes and other local groups that we work alongside.

CRIME UPDATES - 1st to 31st August

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	1	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	3	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary business and community	2	A person commits theft in a building or structure that is not lived in.
Burglary residential	1	Entry and theft in a building or a structure that is lived in.
Criminal Damage	10	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	20	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	0	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	7	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	1	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	1	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
